

It is never possible to visit all areas of these splendid gardens in one visit so, once through the entrance, we all dispersed in various directions, either in search of our favourite areas or just to wander along the many paths and enjoy the herbaceous planting, roses, vegetable and fruit gardens, or more wooded areas. The day went far too quickly!

The Garden Club's plant stall at the Village Fete on 20 July raised £138.50, with half the proceeds to Fornham St. Martin church. We had a more varied stall this year, with everything generously donated by Club members and supporters of the fete. Thus, in addition to the usual mix of small shrubs, perennials, and succulents, we also had freshly picked currants, newly baked shortbread and young leek plants to increase our customers' interest. The Committee extend their grateful thanks to all who contributed by supplying and buying our stock and to the group of helpers who set up, manned and dismantled the stall.

Our speaker at the August meeting was David Ward whose talk, "Making a Drought Resistant Garden", was based around Beth Chatto's famous dry garden in Essex, where David is Garden and Nursery Director. These gardens were established over 30 years ago on sandy and free draining soil, over the area that had been the former car park, and have famously never been watered since! This is particularly amazing in view of the small amount of rainfall each year in that part of Essex, no more than an average of 20 inches (less than some parts of the Middle East and considerably less than the west coast of Scotland that can receive well over 60 inches per annum!) However, even in last summer's heatwave, following 55 days without rain the plants of the Dry Garden picked up again once the wetter days appeared, which is testament to the consideration given to the choice of plants and the establishment of the initial growing conditions. .

David explained that for establishing a dry garden soil preparation is everything. At Beth Chatto's they dug in tons and tons of organic matter and left it to overwinter. Planting followed in the spring and was accompanied by plenty of watering, followed by deep mulching and a second watering. The gravel used to create the areas between the borders is local to the east coast.

Apparently, when designing the original layout, there was no formal design to follow, Beth just laid out the approximate edge of the borders she wished to create using old hosepipes and within which she built up a wonderful palette of plants with varying heights and colour; many of the plants were ornamental grasses. We watched a wonderful video of Beth Chatto explaining how she used lots of "verticals" such as grasses, galtonia and alliums to create the height, with low level plants running through, and bedding plants and annuals for summer colour. David explained that in a dry garden, through late autumn and winter there will be few flowers, it is more about the shape and foliage of the plants, with grasses looking good in the cooler weather. Indeed, morning frosts on the plants can give these gardens a lovely sculptural feel in the deep winter months. As the weather warms up and the seasons move from spring through to summer, more colour will appear first with spring bulbs, Camassias and flowering Amelanchier trees, through the irises, alliums and bright poppies followed by salvias,

verbascums, verbenas and agapanthus. As the temperatures start to fall once more, sedums come into their own and can add lovely colour to dry gardens at a time of year when the intense colours of summer are over. This was a fascinating talk; we all enjoyed the illustrations, the archive footage of Beth Chatto, hearing of the educational work that is carried out by the Beth Chatto Educational Trust and the garden that was created at this year's Hampton Court Palace Flower Festival as a tribute to Beth.

ELDERBURY FRIENDSHIP AND SOCIAL CLUB





HALLOWEEN PUMPKIN CAKE

Ingredients

300g SR flour

300g light muscovado sugar

3 tsp mixed spice

2 tsp bicarbonate of soda

175g sultanas

half tsp salt

4 eggs, beaten

200g butter, melted

Zest 1 orange

1 tbsp orange juice

500g (peeled weight) pumpkin or

butternut squash flesh, grated



For drenching and frosting

200g pack soft cheese

85g butter, softened

100g icing sugar, sifted

Zest 1 orange and juice of half

- 1. Heat oven to 180c/fan 160/gas 4. Butter and line a $30 \times 20cm$ baking or small roasting tin with baking parchment. Put the flour, sugar, spice, bicarbonate of soda, sultanas and salt into a large bowl and stir to combine. Beat the eggs into the melted butter, stir in the orange zest and juice, then mix with the dry ingredients till combined. Stir in the pumpkin. Pour the batter into the tin and bake for $30 \times 30cm$ mins, or until golden and springy to the touch.
- 2. To make the frosting, beat together the cheese, butter, icing sugar, orange zest and 1 tsp of the juice till smooth and creamy, then set aside in the fridge. When the cake is done, cool for 5 mins then turn it onto a cooling rack. Prick it all over with the skewer and drizzle with the rest of the orange juice while still warm. Leave to cool completely.
- 3. If you like, trim the edges of the cake. Give the frosting a quick beat to loosen, then, using a palette knife, spread over the top of the cake in peaks and swirls. If you're making the cake ahead, keep it in the fridge then take out as many pieces as you want 30 mins or so before serving. Will keep, covered, for up to 3 days in the fridge.

River Lark Catchment Partnership
